Our Online Safety focus for the summer term is 1 am Healthy'.

Below, you will find the focus for each year group and ideas for discussion at home.

Year 1 and 2 are looking at age appropriate games.

Year 1 are thinking about the websites they visit, apps they use and games they play.

Year 2 are reviewing age appropriate games.

Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online. What games do you and your friends like to play online? Can you show me the websites you visit the most? Shall we play your favourite game online together?

Year 3 are learning about advertising, including online ads.
