There will be 3 groups with a maximum of 10 per group. Your child will need a roadworthy bicycle to take part. They will be riding within the school's grounds, with a qualified instructor and **must** be able to cycle already, it is **not** a learn-to-ride course.

The course dates are: 12th Sept, 19th Sept or 26th September 2024

- Roadworthy bike See safety check details below.
- Helmet
- Weather appropriate clothing (raincoat, gloves, sunscreen etc.)
- Water bottle
- Lock Bikes are to be locked in the bike shed on arrival at school.

- Check your child's bike in advance and fix any problems.
